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NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Notice is hereby given of the 113th Annual General Meeting of
Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

- TIME:** 10:00am
(8.30am onwards for registration, membership renewal and annual report collection)

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

An Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held in accordance with the provisions of the Act and on a date no later than two calendar months from the end of the financial year and at a venue to be determined by the Board.

NOTICE OF GENERAL MEETING

- (a) Notice of every General Meeting shall be given to every Member entitled to receive notice, at the address appearing in the Register kept by the Association. The auditor and Directors shall also be entitled to notice of every General Meeting, which shall be sent to their last notified address. No other person shall be entitled as of right to receive notices of General Meetings.
- (b) Preliminary notice of a General Meeting should be issued 42 calendar days prior to the date of the meeting calling for notices of motion and any other business to be conducted at that meeting.
- (c) A notice of a General Meeting shall specify the place and day and hour of meeting and shall state the business to be transacted at the meeting.
- (d) At least 14 calendar days' notice of a General Meeting shall be given to those
Members entitled to receive notice, together with:
 - (i) the agenda for the meeting; and
 - (ii) any notice of motion received from Members

BUSINESS

- (a) The business to be transacted at the Annual General Meeting must include;
 - (i) recording of Attendance and Apologies.
 - (ii) confirmation of previous Annual Meeting Minutes.
 - (ii) presentation of the Annual Report of the Board.
 - (ii) presentation of the financial statement and audit report for the last financial year.
 - (iii) the election of Directors under this Constitution,
 - (iv) the motion for affiliation with the Branch, SLSQ and SLSA.
 - (v) the motion recognising the affiliation of the Association's supporters club;
 - (vi) the appointment of the auditors for the present financial year; and
 - (iv) general business without notice of the Association.

- (b) All business that is transacted at a General Meeting, and all that is transacted at an Annual General Meeting, with the exception of those matters set down in clause 20(a) shall be special business.
- (c) No business other than that provided on the notice shall be transacted at that meeting.

NOTICES OF MOTION

Members shall be entitled to submit notices of motion for inclusion as Special Business at a General Meeting. All notices of motion must be submitted in writing to the Secretary not less than 21 calendar days (excluding receiving date and meeting date) prior to the General Meeting. Notices of motion must include a mover and seconder.

Only Members eligible to vote shall be entitled to submit notices of motion for inclusion as Special Business at a General Meeting.

VOTING AT GENERAL MEETINGS

Members entitled to Vote

Each Member over the age of 15 years and entitled to vote as set out in **clause 11.1** shall have one vote at General Meetings which, subject to this Constitution, shall be exercised by that Member.

As per Section 11, Clause 11.1, Members, pages 11 to 13 of the Constitution:

Active, Reserve Active, Long Service, Past Active and Life Members have the right to be present, to debate and to vote at General meetings.

Probationary, Junior Activities (Nippers), Cadet and Honorary Members shall not have voting rights.

Associate, Award and Associate Junior Activities Parent Members shall not have voting rights unless elected to office or position, which is provided with voting rights by this constitution.

Casting Vote

Where voting at General Meetings is equal, the chairman may exercise a casting vote.

SUBSCRIPTIONS AND FEES

As per Constitution page 13

The annual membership subscription (if any) and fees payable by Members to the Association, the time for and manner of payment shall be determined by the Board from time to time.

Such annual membership fees are payable for the ensuing season to be eligible to stand for office and vote at the Annual General Meeting.

QUORUM

No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business. A quorum for General Meetings shall be 30 Voting Members over the age of 15 years. A quorum for Special General Meetings shall be 50 Voting Members over the age of 15 years of age or 20% of the Voting Members whichever is the greater.

PROXY'S

Proxy voting shall not be permitted at any General Meeting.

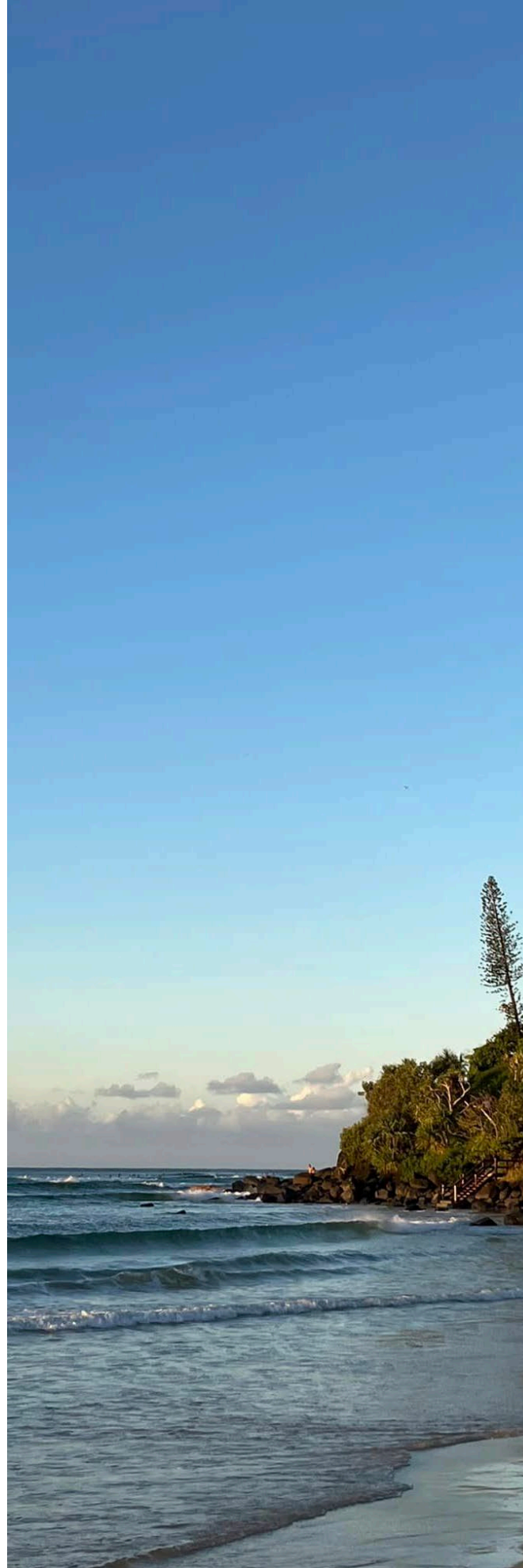

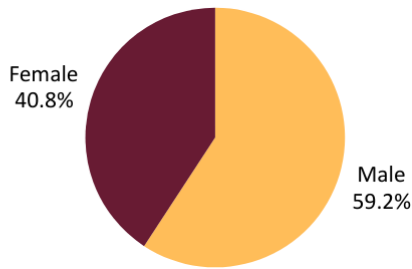

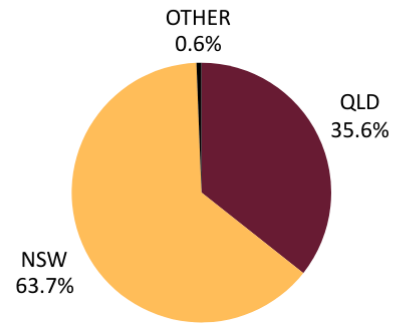
MEMBER DEMOGRAPHICS

Total Members for the 23/24 season - 815

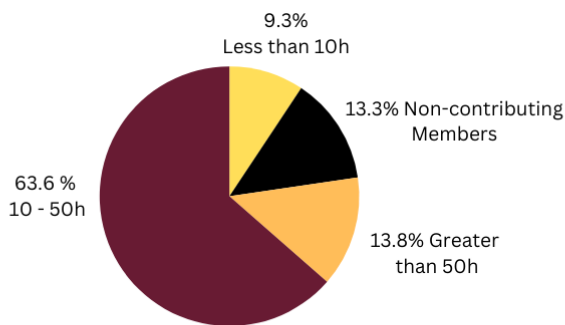
Gender Profile



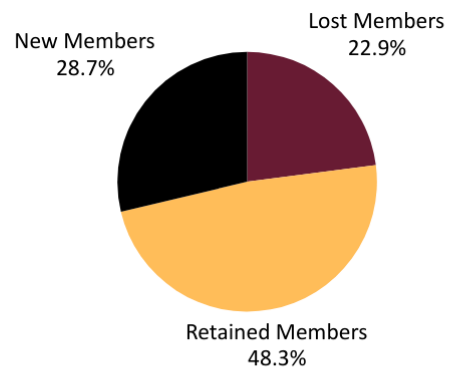
Member Location



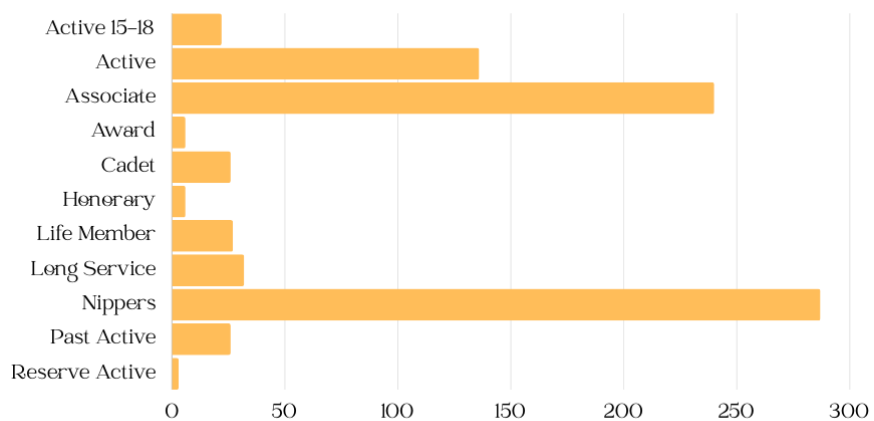
Patrolling Members Contribution

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Whilst the board has been hindered by cashflow following the renovation of the café we have still managed to achieve a lot.

Our AGM in 2023 led to an agreement by the majority of attending members on our spin of SLSQ's Constitution. The Life Members nomination process change was quite difficult to manage but well worth it for this year's successful nomination.

We have updated our By Laws to match the constitution and the current era and they can now be found on our website. It was quite an interesting activity and really made me think what good leadership and a lack of controversy we have had in the 12 years I have been on the Board. Huge sections in the bylaws dealing with "the rules of debate" and "Discipline, Penalties and Appeals" that I knew nothing about because they just weren't relevant or needed.

The reason the café renovation made cashflow difficult is due to the surf club and supporters club funding the café renovations from available cash. We battled to get finance from the bank before the special general meeting, which I was grateful enough of you attending, to the moment we had to just give up and go on our own. The challenge with balancing staff and reading weather forecasts is something hospitality management don't do all the time. Coming from construction, I know how much rain we have had over summer when we expected the best profits. When the sun is out, it's a line up for coffees!

We have the Board of Management and Life Members honour boards back up in the club with enough room on them which won't ever make new honour boards a concern for anyone reading this. I have been working on the Surf Sports boards with the hope to get all the information together and honour boards up in the supporter's club before the end of my term next year.

Whilst we always would like to be more of a focus from the GCCC they have continued to work with us and support us well this season as has our Point Danger Branch Management and Surf Lifesaving Queensland.

OPERATIONS MANAGER

FROM THE OPERATIONS MANAGER

I would like to start by saying Tweed Heads & Coolangatta SLSC is a great club made up of great people with the majority of people like minded as to why they are a part of this club.

The 2023 season at TH&C was marked by significant achievements, challenges, and operational advancements.

Membership remains healthy with a steady increase in both active patrolling and junior members, giving us a total membership of 815 an increase of 69 over the 2022/23 season.

Our patrol teams demonstrated exceptional dedication and professionalism throughout the season, conducting numerous preventative actions and effecting timely rescues when necessary. Despite facing increased beach attendance and challenging conditions, our patrols-maintained vigilance and upheld the highest standards of safety for beachgoers.

Investments in equipment upgrades and maintenance significantly enhanced our operational capabilities. Through the season we purchased a New Zodiac IRB and have put a deposit on another to be delivered during the 24/25 season. With the ongoing requirement to

ensure our IRB fleet can continue to operate we also purchased a new motor and expect to add a new motor to the pool each year to reduce our ongoing service and repair costs,

The procurement of state-of-the-art rescue equipment and the refurbishment of key facilities including the fit out of new equipment to the first aid room improved efficiency and safety across all operational areas.

TH&C strengthened its ties with the local community through various outreach programs and collaborative initiatives. Partnerships with local businesses and government agencies enabled us to expand our reach and deliver impactful safety messages to a broader audience.

The 2023 season at TH&C was a testament to the dedication, and collaborative spirit of our members. Despite facing challenges, we emerged stronger and more resilient, reaffirming our commitment to safeguarding the lives of beachgoers and upholding the values of surf lifesaving and ensuring Greenmount Beach remains Safe and Fun.

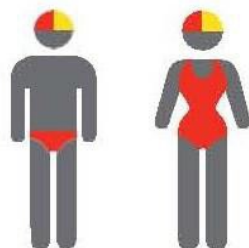

TRAINING ROOM

FROM THE TRAINING ROOM

Hi everyone and welcome to the 2023/2024 Annual Report from the Training Room.

This report is, I think, my 22nd from the training room and it only feels like yesterday when I first took the job as Chief Training Officer at TH&C. I was a trainer for a couple of years until the CTO at the time, Greg Ginger, left the scene and left me as the only trainer in the Club. Boy was my work cut out, I was running around like a one-legged tap dancer for a while until I was able to settle into a sort of training routine, training SRC, Bronze Medallion, IRB Crew and Drivers, as well as running Club Proficiencies. Some of you may recall that we had to run pre-proficiency days, days where I had to make sure everyone was prepared for the actual proficiency day.

As the only IRB trainer, I was out in the boat all day with the candidates, and we used to get a few at that time, performing mock rescues with patients, teaching new drivers and crew the techniques necessary to successfully perform in an IRB. Not all however were successful and we had quite a few hairy moments during the training. This is part and parcel for the job and trainees learned from their mistakes. It was great fun though and no trainees ever suffered a reportable injury during the training. In fact, to my knowledge, we have only ever had two reportable injuries in the boats, both leg injuries, which I think is a

good result considering the risks involved in driving and crewing an IRB.

Things are much better now. We now have a great training facility, four fully operational IRBs, five fully operational outboard motors with 7 active trainers. Due to Grants raised and funds contributed by the BOM and the Old Boys over the years we really lack for nothing when it comes to training resources, although it would be of considerable benefit when we finally have the acoustic room divider installed in the Training Room. Having this would allow us to run two training spaces at the same time, as well as filtering out some of the noise experienced during training sessions from outside sources. It's on our wish list.

All the Training Team have been busy throughout the season running SRC, Bronze, IRB Crew and Driver, Radio, Observer, SSV and Tractor courses, however what we are now finding is the worrying lack of participants enrolling in the courses. As always, life can interfere with our best intentions. The complications of life today make it very difficult for people to find the time necessary to be a volunteer and we do not envisage it getting much better in the future.

Now it is thank you time. Big thanks to the BOM and the Old Boys Association and the Supporters Club for their financial help and assistance

throughout the season. As I stated previously, the training facility never lacks for anything, a million percent better than when I first started as a trainer, back then we had an overhead projector, some manuals, a few manakins and that was all, nothing else. (we still have the overhead projector, never know when it might come in handy).

Big thank you for the administrative support by Grant and Kristal in the office, we could not function without them. Thank you to the active

Training Team of Chris Van Dorn, Amanda Higgerson, Geoff Carlin, Deb Scotman, Jy Taylor and John Manning. Without these people who give a great deal of their time in developing our members we also could not function, I am very grateful for their selfless contribution to the Club.

Will wind this report up now, look forward to seeing you all at the proficiency days starting in August 2024.

2023/24 Season Overview

- The club finished the season with 313 registered Nippers. This was up from 262 in season 2022/23.
- As our junior member numbers have grown, so has the need to finance our activities and equipment. We were blessed with increased sponsorship and fundraising this year.
- We introduced a new Surf Sports Training Squad, resulting in record numbers of our Nippers attending weekly beach and surf training and carnivals.
- We had 16 of our junior members achieve their SRC or Bronze awards and join patrols through the season, as well as having 11 parents qualify.

President's Report

We've had another very strong season with a further increase in Nipper numbers this year. Several initiatives were introduced to accommodate our numbers in a safe and coordinated way, and these have proven to be successful. Our five youngest age groups now have discretely coloured caps, and this has meant a great sight on the beach as well as making it far easier to spot each age group as they move between activities.

Our Surf Sports programme has always accommodated those keen to compete a pathway to carnival success through our coaching sessions. This year we formalised our competitors in dedicated competition squads, and this has allowed us to accommodate larger numbers of kids across our various coaching sessions, as well as more efficient carnival coordination. Our surf and beach coaches – Chelsea Lane and Kane Haley – once again inspired our athletes to success at carnivals, as well as promoting confidence for all our Nippers. It was another busy carnival season with one more carnival squeezed in to the year, and our competitors did us proud at all levels. In particular I'd like to congratulate our 15 great medallists at the Youth State Titles. This included an awesome third in March Past which set the beach alight will be remembered for some time! We have a great foundation for outstanding results next season and look forward to further enhancing our coaching programme in 2024/25.

One of the more inspiring aspects of the TH&C Nipper programme is seeing our young crew patrolling Greenmount Beach each year. Sixteen of our younger members achieved their Bronze or SRC awards, and this was only possible with the

support of our awesome Training team. A special mention again should be made of Amanda Higgerson who showed so much flexibility in supporting our Nipper kids and parents to get qualified this season.

The involvement of parents was again a highlight through the year. We had a solid number of new carnival officials qualify, as well as water safety support. Despite training session attendance approaching 40 kids on regular occasions, we always managed to provide safe and adequate support in the water. Engagement of parents and guardians contributes so much to the successful running of our club, and I'm sure this will continue through next season. Finally, I've decided to hand over the reins this year and step down from the Nipper presidency. I want to thank everyone for their support over the last few years. It has been an honour to see our programme grow from the covid dealt challenges, and a blessing to see the happy faces on the beach each weekend. I am sure the success will continue, and I'll see you back on the beach each weekend in a different role.

Financial Update

Our growing member numbers have led to a robust increase in the cost of operating our Nipper programme. We were very fortunate to build further on our fundraising efforts this year, as well as welcoming a new major sponsor in Victory Ford. This has allowed us to continue one of the coast's best Nipper programmes in the face of rising costs of equipment and general services.

Revenues were substantially increased to \$114,800 through the season, with clothing sales, BBQ takings, sponsorship support and another successful 200 Club delivering the uplift. This allowed us

to deliver new equipment, our great coaching and carnival programme, and to subsidise the costs of mandatory Nipper clothing and equipment through the year. We ran a surplus of over \$28,000, ensuring that we can prepare for next season with sufficient clothing and equipment pre-orders.

BUILDING DEVELOPMENT COORDINATOR

FROM THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT COORDINATOR

The completion of the Stage 3 redevelopment works has provided the club with a new first aid centre, new entrance, function room, Supporters Club offices, upgraded kiosk and a new veranda at the western end of the club. These works have already contributed to a significant increase in turnover and sets the club up for a very successful future.

Major work that still remains includes the upgrade of the men and women's toilets and a new bar in the Supporters Club.

It is now important to implement a maintenance plan that will ensure the facilities we have are kept in good condition and avoid costly repairs into the future. A maintenance budget will be developed as part of the strategic planning meeting to be held on 1st June.

As part of the Stage 3 works additional smoke alarms were installed throughout the club. It is important that members undertaking any activity that generates smoke, heat or dust ensure that they are well clear of smoke detectors or cover the detector with plastic. We have already incurred costs with the fire brigade attending false call outs and

we want to avoid any more in the future.

The Gold Coast City Council presented the club with a master plan in June 2018 for a significant upgrade of the public area surrounding the club, consisting mainly of soft and hard landscaping works. The club welcomed the proposal for not only improving the surrounding area but the establishment of additional turfed areas where nippers could safely assemble of a morning away from vehicles and equipment being used for patrol set up. Despite many follow up meetings with council staff and our local member the council has not committed to undertaking any of the works included in the master plan. This, in despite of assurances being given that funding would be included in future budgets.

The club feels that they have pulled their weight with council. The ongoing maintenance of the rear garden established and funded by the club on council land was to be taken over by the council at the end of the 12 month maintenance period. After observing that in the space of a year the council did nothing to maintain the garden the club signed an agreement with council that it would undertake future maintenance relieving the council of any responsibility.

The strip of land between the training centre and the public pathway had always been a problem with attempts to batter and turf the slope continually failing. Given that the majority of the land fell outside our lease and in council land and this area was included to be upgraded in the 2018 master plan the council was approached to assist with funding a concrete slab and artificial turf. The council refused and the club funded all the work.

I believe the club can feel very let

down by the council and our local member who is supposed to represent us. Surf clubs in the Southern Gold Coast, including Rainbow Bay, Coolangatta, Kirra and North Kirra all have facilities close by provided by council – covered shelters, BBQs and playgrounds. TH&C have none of these facilities and it would appear that the council has no intention of supporting us.

I’ve often wondered is it because we have “Tweed Heads” in our club name.

NEW LIFE MEMBERS

James Sullivan has almost literally spent his whole life at the Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club. He joined the Nippers in 1972, completing all the Nipper years and awards. The Surf Club briefly lost Jamie until the end of his senior year in high school where with a group of mates he returned to the surf club, completed his bronze medallion and started patrolling.

Jamie can share his stories of his late teens and early 20's going from Summer Surf life Saving to Winter Baa Baa Rugby Union as there were few dull moments. In that time, he completed his Silver Medalion, patrolled a minimum of 10 seasons and competed regularly in the surf boats.

As a young local accountant Jamies first role was on the Supporters club Board of management as Treasurer in 1993 for multiple seasons.

When starting at the Surf Club as a Parent, Jamie's involvement in the surf club really stepped up. He was Ruby's age manager from 2009 to 2019, Nipper treasurer from 2010 to 2018, Club Secretary from 2013 to 2015 and Club Treasurer from 2016 to this day. All roles were attacked with enthusiasm and intelligently.

Jamies support of the Nippers and the Youth of the club is unwavering. From hosting multiple Nipper or Youth functions on his property, securing Twin towns grants and multiple sponsorships. He is found at every fund raiser and very willing to jump in and lend a hand.

Like many of us Dave and Nicky Started as Nipper BBQ Coordinators and Water safety. It quickly grew to Age Manager and Nipper Vice President. During that time, and in a good team, the Nippers excelled and grew to the low 300 Nippers in number. The Nippers success in Number of awards and Carnival Medals came with it.

Dave is a Natural Leader and an experienced General Manager of Large-Scale Businesses. The Nipper Vice Presidency was not going to be enough for long. There were two seasons as Director of Surf Sports to see how the Board of Management works and then the Surf Club Presidency in season 2018 / 19.

By Dave's second season as President the clubs Active and Nipper memberships had grown to record levels. Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Lifesaving Club won Branch, State and then Australian Surf Club of the Year. Dave's high level of professionalism and leadership had the surf club flying.

Future Generations will struggle to understand how the world was then shut down by a serious flu. Dave's new challenge was a divided club. Two thirds of his membership were caught on the opposite side of the border from the surf club. In those seasons the club managed all functions and continued its strong record.

Managing the club out of covid was a gradual and to some part ongoing process. The surf club renovations were completed, external works finished, and the café negotiated back into the surf clubs control and all ready to add profits to the club. FROM THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE

This year our clubs Profit & Loss statement shows a loss of over \$64,000 which if we were to add back the non-cash expense for accrued depreciation of \$255,000 we would still have a profit of \$191,000. As you can see in the accounts the Supporters Club have now changed to paying monthly rent of approximately \$40,000 this started in July 2023 and before this in our financial year, they still did donate \$79,000. Other monies in addition to this received from the Supporters Club have been used to reimburse the Surf Club for assets it purchased for the Function room and the outfitting of the new Café. These assets belong better on the balance sheet of the Supporters Club, and this is where they are now being depreciated.

I thank the Supporters Club for their entire contribution being made as donations and now rent. The recent strategic meeting is developing a plan going forward which will ensure that we are in a good financial position for years to come and although the renovations, the function room and café are now all complete we can still all expect to see further ongoing improvements in our facilities as funds allow.

Please make sure that you support our Supporters Club, as you can see the results will put our Club in a better position. I would like to thank them for the great job they have done and continue to do.

Our \$1.8 million Westpac Loan is now down to \$1.708 with our loan repayments being \$20,000 in advance. The loan re-draw facility is now in place, and we are hoping that surplus funds from both our Club and the Supporters Club can take advantage of this and save the Club some interest off into the future. The loan if not paid down ahead of schedule will still take almost 9 years to finalise.

The Old Boys again deserve a huge thank you for all of their fundraising efforts and all of their volunteering when needed. Their work contributes immensely to lower our costs and increasing our fundraising dollars.

Also, Grant Brown has greatly assisted me in my role as treasurer and again I thank him and Kristal for all their contributions, they both go over and beyond.

Finally, I would like to remind everyone that we need to be mindful of our costs which are forever rising. With Workcover for example, during the year almost doubling and it and other insurance costs are expected to continue to increase. Thus, we need to contain other costs which can be contained, continue to fundraise with diligence and do all we can to ensure our Supporters Club continues to trade well. Hopefully we can decrease the scheduled 9 years we have on our loan.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Corporate Information

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981* (Qld) and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* (Cth). The committee has determined that the Charity is not a reporting entity.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are for the Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. The Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981* (Qld) and is registered as a Charity under the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* (Cth).

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following Australian accounting standards have been applied in the preparation of these financial statements:

- AASB 101 - Presentation of Financial Statements
- AASB 107 - Statement of Cash Flows
- AASB 108 - Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors
- AASB 1048 - Interpretation of Standards
- AASB 1054 - Australian Additional Disclosures

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Charity is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* (Cth). Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI). Further, Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Comparative Figures

When required by the applied Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability.

c. Economic Dependence

Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Tweed Heads & Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet its financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Tweed Heads & Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

d. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

e. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee of management evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Charity.

Key estimates

The estimate of the useful life of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

Key judgments

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the leasehold improvements, plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee of management.

f. Contributions

If and when Tweed Heads and Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions from the government or other parties for nothing or a nominal value the contributions would be recognised at the fair value on the date of acquisition upon which time an asset is taken up in the Statement of Financial Position and revenue in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

g. Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Grant revenue is recognised in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income when the Charity obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the Charity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

h. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less, and bank overdrafts.

i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

j. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

k. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1n for details of impairment).

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis over the asset's useful life to the Charity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. The rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

l. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the Charity during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

m. Employee Benefits

Retirement benefit obligations - superannuation benefits

All employees of the Charity receive defined contribution superannuation entitlements, for which the Charity pays the fixed superannuation guarantee contribution (currently 11.0% [11.5% from 01 July 2024] of the employee's ordinary times earnings) to the employee's superannuation fund of choice. All obligations for unpaid superannuation guarantee contributions are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled and are recognised as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Charity's Statement of Financial Position.

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Charity's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled. The Charity's obligations for short-term employee benefits are recognised as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

m. Employee Benefits (continued)

Long-term employee benefits

The Charity only classifies employees' long service leave entitlements as long-term employee benefits as they are not expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service. Provision is made for the Charity's obligation for long-term employee benefits, which are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations. Upon the remeasurement of obligations for long-term employee benefits, the net change in the obligation is recognised in profit or loss classified under employee benefits expense.

The Charity's obligations for long-term employee benefits are recognised as provisions under non-current liabilities in its Statement of Financial Position, except where the Charity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are recognised as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

n. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

o. Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are recognised as expenses on a straight-line basis over the lease term.
